

# Song & Cheer Competition Squads Tryout Procedure Information 2025-2026

- Program tryouts will be held at Los Alamitos High School on March 31, April 3, 2025. There will be a skills portion as well as routines/cheers. (There is a Tryout Information Night on Tuesday, March 4th at 6:00PM at the Los Alamitos High School College & Career Center. The orientation meeting is not mandatory, but answers general questions and all try out paperwork can be turned in that night.)
- 2. Have five teachers complete the recommendation form and directly return them to Mrs. Ramirez, no later than March 21, 2025. These can be turned in at the parent meeting. (Do not return them unless they are in a sealed envelope.) ALL RECOMMENDATIONS MUST COME FROM YOUR CURRENT TEACHERS! Recommendations must go to the following current teachers: English, Math, PE/Sport, and TWO of your choice. If you're currently in cheer or song at LAHS, you must give one to Mrs. Ramirez and one to your coach. If in a PE/Sport at LAHS, you must have your coach complete a recommendation.
- 3. Turn in the information sheet with your picture attached.
- 4. Have your counselor fill out the grade check and absence report. Your grades are a part of your total score and a part of the final decision.
- 5. **Tryout finals are to be held, April 5, 2025, at Los Alamitos High school, the time is TBD**. If you make the program, you will be notified by phone that night.
- 6. There will be a Booster Club meeting on April 7 at 6:00PM, LAHS College & Career Center, for all parents. We are requesting a \$650.00 program donation and camp donation of \$650.00 at that time. This is the first Booster Club meeting of the new season for the parents and attendance is highly recommended.

## Los Alamitos Song and Cheer-PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Los Alamitos High School song and cheer squads are recognized as a sports activity. Today's cheerleader or songleader is an athlete with special talents, which include gymnastics and dance. All members of the cheer and song squads compete in local, regional and national competitions, as well as performing the duties of crowd leading at a wide variety of sporting events. They set an example for others with their school spirit, leadership, and commitment to their studies. **This program is not for the faint hearted** – it's demanding, both in time and talent. We expect athletes to maintain the highest GPA they are capable of, but all athletes must maintain a 2.0 GPA.

This information packet is designed to answer questions about song and cheer and provide necessary information needed for your son/daughter to participate in tryouts. If you have any questions or need clarification, please email Coach Jennifer Ramirez at JRamirez@losal.org.

- 1. If selected, in the Fall your student will be enrolled in 6<sup>th</sup> period Song/Cheer in (P.E credit for freshman and sophomores, an elective for juniors and seniors.)
- 2. Students must have a physical, this is even for returning athletes. Cheerleading and songleading are highly specialized and demanding physical activities, personal safety as well as the safety of others depends upon good health. Athletes will not be able to participate in summer activities until it is turned in.
- 3. There are four squads: Varsity Cheer, Varsity Song, Junior Varsity Cheer and Junior Varsity Song. The Varsity Cheer and Varsity Song quads are composed of students in grades 9-12. Squad numbers will vary according to the results of tryouts. Junior Varsity Cheer and Song is for students in grades 9-11.
- 4. Students and parents are highly encouraged to participate in various fundraising activities to help support the program. The program is dependent upon parent donations to operate. **OUR FIRST FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES WILL BE THE CALENDAR FUNDRAISER AND VIVA LOS AL**.
- 5. After school practice is <u>MANDATORY</u> and work schedules, doctor appointments, haircuts, homework, and life in general, must be planned around cheer and song schedules. Crowd Leading at football games, basketball games and other sport events as assigned, are mandatory. Failure to attend practice or assigned games will result in benching, a grade point deduction, and possibly removal from a competition squad. (See Grade Sheet)
- 6. Practices in May and June, and summer practices/camp are mandatory.
- 7. Song camp is June 16-19 in Palm Springs.
- 8. Varsity Cheer camp is June 29-July 2 in Phoenix Arizona and *Junior Varsity Cheer camp is July* **25-28** *in Palm Springs*. There is a Camp donation of \$650.00.
- 9. Everyone in song and cheer must plan on practice after school, on some weekends and in the evenings. **We work around coaches' schedules.**

# Song & Cheer Tryouts Parent Permission to Participate

Dear Parent and/or Guardian,

It is imperative that you understand what the commitment to Song/Cheer involves. The Los Alamitos Song/Cheer Program is treated as a sports activity. It's therefore highly competitive, and the overall commitment expected from both parents and students is tremendous. I believe it is an honor and a privilege to be a part of the Los Al tradition. We are recognized around the nation as one of the leading song/cheer programs, and I believe that the benefits of belonging to such an outstanding program far outweigh the sacrifice, but read on and make sure you understand exactly what you are committing to before tryouts.

In the past, problems have arisen, different in nature each year, but most having to do with... "I really wish we had been told about this in the beginning." To that end, I am trying to communicate exactly what is involved, and what the coaches, booster club, and I will be expecting from both you and your son/daughter if he/she makes one of the four squads. There is no way that I can cover every situation, but this letter is an attempt to make the demands and expectations of participation in this program known **BEFORE** the tryout and before you and your student invest a great deal of time and energy.

Prior to the tryout, read the following conditions, rules and expectations. If both parent and student can agree to the following terms, please sign (both parents, where applicable) along with your student, and return prior to tryouts. In order for your student to be allowed to try out, this permission form must be on file no later than March 21, 2025.

Los Alamitos Cheer and Song Leaders are expected to be excellent examples of good sportsmanship, integrity, leadership, school spirit and academic excellence. We have a no tolerance rule for alcohol, drugs, tobacco or fighting. While I cannot police every move of every cheer/song leader, if any cheer/song leader is caught in uniform or at a cheer/song or school function using alcohol, drugs or tobacco, that cheer/song leader will be removed from the squad for the remainder of the year. Suspension from school for any reason will also result in either suspension from the team or immediate removal from the squad. Cheer/song leaders are expected to be leaders in all areas of school life.

### 1. We understand the decision of the judges is FINAL and NOT negotiable after tryouts.

- 2. We understand that there is the potential for injuries in both Song and Cheer, and we agree to provide the necessary insurance policy and copy of the insurance card.
- 3. We understand that there are <u>several major fundraisers</u> and that we will be expected to participate as the program is reliant upon fundraising to operate. We also understand that further fundraisers will be added if necessary. The incoming Booster Executive Board will work out details of each of these. A formal fundraising packet will be handed out at the first Booster

Club meeting, outlining all of the planned fundraisers for 2025-2026. The first two major fundraisers of the season will be:

### **♦** Calendar

Each spirit leader is encouraged to fundraise \$500 through calendar sales/sponsorships. This can come from selling ads, sponsorships or calendars or any combination of the above. More details will be given at the first Booster Club meeting on April 7 at 6:00PM.

### Viva Los Al Fundraiser

Viva Los Al will be held either in August, September or October. Each spirit leader is encouraged to sell <u>four</u> or more tickets to the event and to gather silent auction donations.

- 4. We understand that making one of the four squads does not mean you automatically become a member of the competition squad. Coaches and advisors reserve the right to determine the size of the squad that will compete. Some students may be designated as alternates. Alternates will be required to maintain their skills, attend all practices, games, and competitions.
- 5. We understand that the coaches (with the advice and consent of the advisors) will determine the number of members that will be competing on any competition squad.
- 6. We understand that our daughter may make a Varsity squad, however, by the time competition season begins, coaches have the right to select a squad that may include members of Junior Varsity replacing members of Varsity, if they feel that it will provide the team with the best possible chance of success. This would in no way impact your daughter's participation in football games, basketball games, pep assemblies, etc. Once you have made Varsity, you remain a Varsity member even if you are not competing with the Varsity team.
- 7. We understand and agree that coaches and the advisor will NOT enter into any discussion with parents regarding coaching decisions about selection for the competition squads. We make every attempt to talk with parents on an individual basis if problems arise; however, once decisions are made they are final.
- 8. We understand that the coaches and advisors will be happy to discuss our student's strengths and weaknesses, with him/her, in order to help each student increase their skills. We also understand that we (the parents) are not always the best judge of our student's talents we think they are perfect and that the coach and advisor have to consider the team as a whole rather than each individual.
- 9. We understand everyone may not be on a competition squad; however, everyone is responsible for all fundraising events.
- 10. We understand that practice begins on April 14, 2025, and continues through June (plan your vacations in July), resumes again on August 4, 2025, and continues throughout the year. Practices are long and demanding, sometimes involving evenings, vacations and weekends. Your son/daughter needs your help in developing time management skills in order to maintain his/her grades. [CHEER WILL RESUME JULY 21ST FOR ALL TEAMS WILL ALSO HAVE JUNE 2ND-6TH OFF AND AUGUST 5TH-8TH OFF]

- 11. We understand that song and cheer must become the 1<sup>st</sup> priority in terms of co-curricular activities. Jobs, other clubs, organizations, etc., must be arranged around practice and activities for song/cheer. Failure to do so may result in removal from a competition squad, benching at games and/or lowering of grades.
- 12. We understand that if our student misses a practice for an unexcused reason, he/she may be benched for the following game/competition and their grade will reflect the absence. Unexcused summer practices will result in removal from the program.
- 13. We understand that our son/daughter is expected to be in 6<sup>th</sup> period each day for roll and failure to do so will result in an absence and absences from class may result in a lower grade. We understand that we can expect a grade of "A" for participation in song/cheer, but it is not automatic. Absences from practice and attitude issues may affect the ending grade.
- 14. We understand that Junior Varsity is not the same as Varsity. JV Song and JV Cheer are expected to cheer for Freshman Football, JV Football, JV Basketball, and other games as assigned.
- 15. We understand that Varsity Cheer and Varsity Song will be required to cheer for Varsity Football and basketball games, wrestling, water polo, girl's basketball, and volleyball.
- 16. We understand that if our son/daughter is selected this year, he/she will still have to try out again next year, and his/her position on the squad is <u>NOT</u> guaranteed. Improvement, attitude, and talent all play a part in whether or not he/she returns. A bad attitude in the classroom will almost guarantee that he/she will not be returning; a bad attitude at practice will probably assure it.
- 17. We understand that teams are chosen on a basis of grades, teacher recommendations, talent, and overall team needs.
- 18. All official college visits for Stunt and Acro must be cleared and approved by the coach and advisor.

I sincerely hope that you understand that while we love every one of our athletes, it is impossible to make them happy all of the time, especially when it comes to selection of competition squads. Competition seems to become tougher every year, therefore we cannot guarantee a place on the squad even though they may have been on the squad the previous year. Outside judges are used to making scoring as objective as possible. If you look carefully at the scoring guide, you'll see that because of teacher recommendations and GPA, talent alone will not determine if your daughter makes the squad. We are looking for students who can represent Los Alamitos High School, both as excellent cheer/song leaders, and as excellent role models for the student body.

Students need to also consider their priorities. While song and cheer are considered competition squads, cheering for school activities and representing Los Al is a first priority. If crowd leading at games isn't something that is important to them - there are all-star cheer teams and studio dance teams in the area, which are made up of members who prefer competition to crowd leading, and are not as concerned with school behavior and/or grades.

Please take the time to re-read this; once you sign and return the attached permission form, I will hold you responsible for the agreed upon items. I realize this is a lot to take in - especially those of you who have never participated before, but at the same time, I'd like to be as clear as possible to prevent misunderstandings. If you have questions, please email me as soon as possible. We hope to see you at the Song & Cheer Tryout Information Meeting on Thursday, March 4, 2025 at 6:00PM in LAHS College & Career Center, where all questions and/or concerns can be addressed.

### **VARSITY CHEER**

- Standing Back Tuck and a round-off back tuck (minimum gymnastics, requirement). Points are awarded to those with more advanced gymnastics skills.
- Perform and execute an elite jump combination including but not limited to a Toe Touch, Pike, Front Hurdler.
- The ability to either fly, base, or back spot at an elite level. The coaching staff will make the final decision of which position(s) your child tryouts for based on the needs of the team.
- Sharp, consistent cheer/dance motions
- Elite performance skills: eye contact, smile, enthusiasm, confidence, showmanship, etc.
- GPA: minimum of 2.0, 2.5 or above is preferred.
- Positive teacher recommendations Good attitude willing to take directions.
- Crowd involvement and performance of tryout routine at an elite level during crowd leading and performance of skills.

### JUNIOR VARSITY CHEER

- Standing back handspring and or round-off back handspring
- Points are given to those with more advanced gymnastics skills.
- Perform and execute an elite jump combination including but not limited to a Toe Touch, Pike, Front Hurdler.
- The ability to either fly, base, or back spot at an elite level. The coaching staff will make the final decision of which position(s) your child tryouts for based on the needs of the team.
- Sharp, consistent cheer/dance motions
- Superior performance skills: eye contact, smile, enthusiasm, confidence, showmanship, etc.
- GPA: minimum of 2.0, 2.5 or above is preferred.
- Positive teacher recommendations Good attitude willing to take directions.
- Crowd involvement and performance of tryout routine at a superior level during crowd leading and performance of skills.

### JV AND VARSITY SONG

- Dance experience
- Toe touch, pike and other jumps, kick line
- Leaps: scissors, side (2<sup>nd</sup>), split
- Turns: axle, triples, quad, advanced second turn combos
- Flexibility, splits, leg hold (right and left), leg hold turns
- Performance of tryout routine
- Sharp Clean Motions
- Performance skills: eye contact, smile, enthusiasm, confidence, showmanship
- GPA: minimum 2.0, 2.5 or above is preferred
- Positive teacher recommendations-Good attitude—willing to take direction

### **Grading Policy for 2025-2026**

Your grade for this course is broken down into 4 areas. Everyone starts the course with 250 points. **The good news is everyone starts with an "A"!** The bad news is you can lose points very easily. Each time you don't comply with the requirements of one of the four areas, you lose 10pts. That means if you get five marks against you, your grade goes down to a "B". The following are the four graded areas:

- ♦ Being on time- Being on time to everything! Practices, buses, competitions and games etc.
- Being properly prepared at practice, games and other events- you must be dressed in proper dress out uniform and performing uniform at all times. If you lose an article of your uniform, you must purchase another. No special items added to your uniform. (no flip flops, jeans, or jewelry.
- Having a positive attitude— You must have a positive attitude at all times. A positive attitude includes respect towards your fellow teammates and coaches.
- ♣ Having regular attendance- you must attend class, games and other mandatory events as listed in the packet and on your calendar. If your absence is unexcused or you leave early thirty points will automatically be subtracted from your grade. If you have more than three unexcused absences, you may be removed from a competition team and or benched from games. Leaving an event unexcused will result in removal from the program.

The grading scale is as follows: 100-90% of total points=A 89-80% of total points =B 79-70% of total points=C 69-60% of total points=D

I understand the grading policy for the Song and Cheer Program at Los Alamitos High School. I understand this is a huge commitment and I am willing to put forth the effort to continue the excellence of this program.

## CODE OF CONDUCT for Athletics, ASB, Performance and Competition Groups

This form is <u>REQUIRED</u> from all students because most Los Alamitos High School Students participate in some sort of co- or extracurricular activity in the course of a year.

An important aspect of high school athletics and activities is learning behavior appropriate to circumstance. Athletes, ASB members, performance and competition groups often represent the school publicly, causing their behavior to be subject to more than the usual scrutiny. Keeping in mind that participation in extra- and co-curricular activities is a privilege and not a right, some behaviors are subject to standard consequences, including removal from the program.

I. The Following Rules & Consequences Apply to ALL Athletes, ASB, Performance & Competition Groups, etc.

DRUGS, ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, NICOTINE, CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES OR INTOXICANTS OF ANY KIND or CHEMICALS
Unlawful possession\*, use, transportation or provisions of drugs, alcohol, nicotine products, electronic cigarettes and other
vapor-emitting devices with or without nicotine content, chemicals or intoxicants or any controlled substance pursuant to Ed. Code
48900, at school, going to and from school, or at a school event shall result in the following:

### 1st Offense -

An immediate removal from all athletic teams, ASB, performance and competition groups for a <u>period of three weeks.</u> During the suspension the student is <u>NOT allowed to attend practices and CANNOT attend games/competitions/events.</u>

### 2nd Offense -

An immediate removal of the student from all athletic teams, ASB, performance and competition groups <u>for a period of nine</u> weeks or the season of sport/activity, \*\* whichever is greater.

## DRUGS. ALCOHOL. TOBACCO. NICOTINE. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES OR INTOXICANTS OF ANY KIND. CHEMICALS OF WEAPONS

The unlawful sale of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, nicotine, controlled substances, chemicals or intoxicants of any kind and/or the use, sale, or possession of weapons pursuant to Ed. Code 48900, at school, going to and from school or at a school event shall result in the immediate disciplinary action subject to the site administration's discretion accompanied by the immediate removal of the student from all athletic teams, ASB, performance and competition groups for a period of nine weeks of the season of sport/activity, \*\* whichever is greater.

- \* Possession of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, nicotine products, electronic cigarettes and other vapor-emitting devices with or without nicotine content, intoxicants or a controlled substance or weapons/chemicals is a serious offense. The term "possession" is so broad that it covers certain cases where you may not have physically touched or you may have had only momentary contact with the alcohol, drugs, intoxicants or controlled substance or weapons/chemicals. You need only have a small degree of control over the situation, i.e. the ability to leave. In short, if you are in the presence of alcohol, drugs, intoxicants, or a controlled substance or weapons/chemicals, you may be charged with unlawful possession.
- \*\* Each sport, ASB, performance and competition group defines in writing its "season of sport/activity."

**Note**: Parent support for this Student Code of Conduct is crucial to its success. Parents who directly or indirectly participate in providing alcohol to students and/or knowingly permit students to drink alcohol are a major concern. These parents are potentially responsible for the adverse consequences to their own child, as well as to the group he/she represents.

II. The Following CIF Rules & Consequences Apply to Athletes:

### **INTERACTION WITH OFFICIALS**

If an athlete physically assaults an official, the athlete shall be banned from interscholastic athletics for the remainder of the student's eligibility. (CIF Blue Book Sect. 522)

### UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

If an athlete is ejected from a game for any reason (unsportsmanlike conduct, fighting, etc.), the athlete shall be prohibited from participating in the next contest. (CIF Rule)

\*\* In addition, many teams, ASB, performance & competition groups have their own written standards for participation for which a student may be suspended or removed from the program.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

All students must be living with the parent/guardian within the boundaries of the school attendance area. If not, the student must be eligible under an inter-district permit.

### ALL STUDENTS (except ASB)

Los Alamitos Unified School District Board Policy 214 provides that participants with less than a 2.0 average for the last semester grade period are placed on "Academic Probation" for the subsequent semester. Students on Academic Probation will work with school staff to monitor progress and provide guidance and support. Two semesters of less than a 2.0 average will result in ineligibility for the subsequent semester and continue until a 2.0 average is attained. During the four high school years, no student will be placed on academic probation more than once.

### ASE

Students elected or appointed to ASB offices have a more stringent academic eligibility requirement. The ASB President and the ASB Vice-President must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA in order to run for office and then must attain at least a 3.0 each semester beginning the semester they are elected. Students elected or appointed to all other ASB positions must have a cumulative 2.5 GPA in order to run for office and then must attain a 2.5 at each semester beginning the semester they are elected or appointed. There is no provision for academic probation for students enrolled in ASB.

### **ATHLETES**

Los Alamitos High School is a member of the C.I.F. Southern Section and Sunset League. TO be eligible to participate in C.I.F. athletics, a student must meet the following criteria:

- Before a student can participate in a sport, he/she must have a clearance from the athletic director stating the student athlete has a physical exam. health insurance, parent consent form, and has signed the Code of Conduct form. (CIF Rule 306)
- Athletes must have passed a minimum of 20 units during the previous semester grading period. Only 5 units can be in physical education. (CIF Rule 204)
- Have proper district residency or be attending on a valid inter-district permit.
- Have proper insurance.
- Be currently enrolled in classes worth 20 credits, only 5 of which may be from Physical Education.
- Be under 19 years of age as of June 15th of a student's junior (or third) year.
- Refer to the 2.0 Rule below.

The 2.0 Rule - Any student participating in extra- or co-curricular activities must maintain a GPA of 2.0 or above each semester. If the student falls below a 2.0 for a semester, s/he is given probationary status. If the student again falls below a 2.0 for another semester during his/her high school career, s/he will be ineligible to participate until a 2.0 semester GPA is achieved at a semester grading period.



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### Code of Ethics - Athletes

Athletics is an integral part of the school's total educational program. All school activities, curricular and extracurricular, in the classroom and on the playing field, must be congruent with the school's stated goals and objectives established for the intellectual, physical, social and moral development of its students. It is within this context that the following Code of Ethics is presented.

As an athlete, I understand that it is my responsibility to:

- 1. Place academic achievement as the highest priority.
- 2. Show respect for teammates, opponents, officials and coaches.
- 3. Respect the integrity and judgment of game officials.
- 4. Exhibit fair play, sportsmanship and proper conduct on and off the playing field.
- Maintain a high level of safety awareness.
- 6. Refrain from the use of profanity, vulgarity and other offensive language and gestures.
- 7. Adhere to the established rules and standards of the game to be played.
- 8. Respect all equipment and use it safely and appropriately.
- Refrain from the use of alcohol, tobacco, illegal and non-prescriptive drugs, anabolic steroids or any substance to increase physical development or performance that is not approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration, Surgeon General of the United States or American Medical Association.
- Know and follow all state, section and school athletic rules and regulations as they pertain to eligibility and sports participation.
- 11. Win with character, lose with dignity.

As a condition of membership in the CIF, all schools shall adopt policies prohibiting the use and abuse of androgenic/anabolic steroids. All member schools shall have participating students and their parents, legal guardian/caregiver agree that the athlete will not use steroids without the written prescription of a fully licensed physician (as recognized by the AMA) to treat a medical condition (Article 524).
